At a recent press conference on Sept. 17, Gov. David Ige, Superintendent Dr. Christina Kishimoto, and Dr. Sarah Kemble, Deputy Hawai'i State Epidemiologist, announced that Hawai'i's public schools will be using newly released guidance from the Hawai'i State Department of Health (DOH) to plan appropriate learning models for the remainder of the academic year.

The second quarter will begin as a continuation of learning from home. Our school will be working with others in the complex area to ensure that all campuses meet DOH's guidance, allowing us to start the process of bringing students back to school safely. Schools will be planning a gradual rollout of blended learning opportunities and continue to monitor COVID activity in their communities.
