The Office of Curriculum, Instruction and Student Support is extending the invitation to interested schools to participate in the three year shared e-Book Collection pilot for school years (SY) 2014-17.

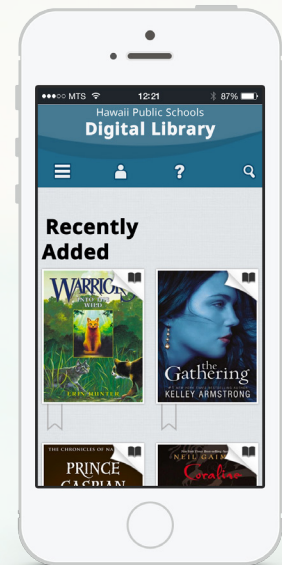
Interested schools must submit the attached order form and payment, no later than *Tuesday, September 30, 2014.*

Why Participate?

- Access to \$90,000 worth of eBooks and audiobooks in the first year for a fraction of the cost.
- Collection grows each year by \$90,000 or more each year for a fraction of the cost.
- 24/7 Access to eBooks and Audiobooks from internet accessible device.
- NO overdues and lost books; automatic returns at end of loan period
- Accessible via iPhone, iPod Touch, iPad, Mac, Windows phone, Windows 8 tablet, BlackBerry, BlackBerry Playbook, Android, Sony Reader Wifi, Kindle Fire, Nook Tablet, Kubo, Chromebook, desktop, laptop computers
- Searchable by Lexile, ATOS, reading and interests levels, formats, publishers, keyword, title, author, subject.
- Able to add titles to a Wish List, placing titles on hold, star rate titles.
- Engage students in the collection development through the “Recommend Titles” feature.
- No login management at the school level. Student and staff accounts handled at the state level.
- Using Overdrive, the same eBook platform as the Hawaii State Public Library to make it easy to borrow from either library.
- Provides access to the most popular eBook and audiobooks available.

The financial commitment per school each year is based on student enrollment:

- » 0-500: \$500/year
- » 501-1000: \$600/year
- » 1000+: \$700/year
