How are students performing in each subject?


Measures the percent of students meeting the standard/who are proficient on state assessments.

The Median Growth Percentile (MGP) shows the relative progress of the average student on state assessments. For example, an MGP of 60 means the average student performance was better than 60% of students that scored similarly on previous state assessments.


How many students missed 15 or more days of school this year?

How do you measure how well a school is doing? In our estimation, it's more than scores on high-stakes tests. Schools should show that they are supporting children along the educational pipeline toward college, career, and community readiness. Are our students attending school? Are they graduating? Are they going to college? And how successfully are schools reducing the achievement gap between highneeds and non-high needs students?

The Strive HI Performance System was designed to account for these factors in student success. Initially created in 2013 by a U.S. Department of Education waiver from certain aspects of the former No Child Left Behind Act, Strive HI has been refocused by the goals and priorities of the 2017-2020 Department of Education and **Board of Education Strategic** Plan, the governing document for the public education system. Our Strategic Plan provides a common foundation of expectations and supports for public education, centering on closing the achievement gap to ensure equity and excellence in our schools.

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Our Story

Aliamanu Middle School believes in supporting our young adolescent students in this unique time in their lives, which is filled with a multitude of transition and change. At Aliamanu Middle we are building systems to monitor and nurture our students as they move from the elementary setting, to dealing with their physical, social and emotional focuses, to truly prepare them with the skills necessary to excel in high school and beyond.

Working together, the teachers at Aliamanu Middle continue to strengthen instruction and relationships to meet the needs of our learners. Using department planning time, and bringing back the teaming concept, teachers collaborate to monitor student progress. This team approach has been infused in our system for testing at Aliamanu Middle. We have started a partnership among all content area teachers to create a testing environment, which allows us to reflect and assess the learning of our students.

In our efforts to support the whole child, Aliamanu Middle also works closely with the Radford Complex schools to cultivate initiatives such as AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination), technology integration, and RTI (Response to Intervention) to enhance student learning.

The Strategic Plan

The Strategic Plan describes shared objectives for equity and excellence for every child. To measure progress on the Strategic Plan, we report on key statewide success indicators. These indicators represent the health of public education, focusing on those which have greatest impact on student success, as well as state and federal requirements. They do not comprehensively represent the diverse measures of success valued by our nearly 300 schools.
