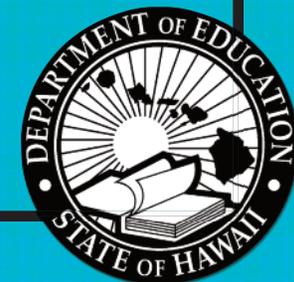

Technology & Safety

Providing your child with the use of a laptop computer opens exciting, new learning opportunities. However, we recognize that with this opportunity comes new responsibilities. Therefore, we have taken steps to keep your child and their computers safe. The Access Learning program will teach students how to safeguard their school computers and protect themselves from harm. We also encourage you talk to your child about the best practices they learned in school and reinforce them at home and in your community.

REPORTING STOLEN/LOST LAPTOPS

Each laptop is equipped with a security tracking software that facilitates the recovery of stolen or lost computers. The feature is activated only once a laptop is reported stolen or misplaced.

If your child's laptop is lost or stolen, please report the incident to police by dialing 911, followed by a call to the school. Please provide the school with a police report number, officer information and any other relevant details.

The school will collaborate with police and the security software company to track down and recover stolen devices.

KEY SAFETY TIPS

- ✓ Keep laptops out of sight, such as stored in a book bag or a locker.
- ✓ Don't use laptops where they may be damaged, such as near water or food.
- ✓ Never leave your laptop unattended.
- ✓ Don't lend your device to anyone.
- ✓ If a stranger tries to take away a student's laptop, the student should never try to resist in any way.

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
