Positive Prevention PLUS provides evidence-based instruction for comprehensive sexual health education and teen pregnancy prevention, aligned with National Health Education Standards.

Positive Prevention PLUS for upper elementary school addresses the physical, social, and emotional changes during puberty; human reproduction; hygiene; diseases and their transmission; friendship; boundaries and bullying; and staying safe and healthy.

Positive Prevention PLUS for middle school, high school, and special education addresses risk factors and behaviors associated with teen pregnancy prevention by increasing adolescents' ability to use risk-reduction skills, including contraceptive use, resistance and negotiation skills, and accessing reproductive health services. The program seeks to teach adolescents to either delay/abstain from sexual activity or use birth control consistently and correctly when engaging in sexual activity.
