Requirements for Baselines & Targets

Baselines

State can reset the baselines if:

- Calculation methodology changed.
- Data measurement method or process is revised.

Targets

Targets Must:

- Be rigorous, yet achievable.
- Show improvement over baseline.
- Be set with the advice of stakeholders.
- Be rooted in, and build on, past experience when possible.

Indicator 12: Early Childhood Transition

Percent of children referred by Part C prior to age 3, who are found eligible for Part B, and who have an [Individualized Education Program] IEP developed and implemented by their third birthdays.
