

**A REPORT TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND
THE LEGISLATURE ON THE DEPARTMENT OF
EDUCATION'S FINDINGS RELATING TO
SCHOOL-LEVEL ACTIVITIES THAT PROMOTE
CIVIC LEARNING IN STUDENTS**

(S.R. NO. 102, REGULAR SESSION OF 2005)

December 8, 2005

Overview

The Department of Education (Department) is pleased to present this report in response to Senate Resolution No. 102, Regular Session of 2005, on the following:

- (1) An inventory of school-level activities that promote civic learning/civic responsibility in students; and
- (2) General findings and comments from the civic responsibility focus group meetings conducted statewide to develop:
 - a. A working definition of civic responsibility; and
 - b. Indicators of civic-learning activities.

I. Inventory of School-Level Activities

The Department collected information from all of the public schools regarding community service, student volunteer activities, and service-learning projects for School Year 2004-05. This information is reflected in a Department publication entitled “***Trend Report: Educational and Fiscal Accountability***”.

Although the terms “community service”, “volunteer activities”, and “service-learning” are often used interchangeably, there are notable distinctions. Community service and volunteerism are actions that contribute to the community without any formal attachment to curriculum outcomes. The focus of the activity or program is on service.

Service-learning also seeks to make valuable contributions to the community; however, it links community service experiences to classroom instruction. As such, service-learning integrates into students’ academic curriculum with structured time for students to think, talk, or write about their experience.

A summary of community service projects are listed below:

While 8 schools did not respond to the Department's request for this information, 247 schools submitted a listing of community service, student volunteer activities, or service learning projects.

Attachment A is a list of the schools and a comprehensive inventory of their activities for School Year 2004-05.

II. Statewide Civic Responsibility Focus Group Meetings

The Department conducted statewide civic responsibility focus group meetings in the fall of 2005. The focus groups were comprised of principals, teachers, other school staff, community members, students, and parents. Staff from the Office of Curriculum, Instruction and Student Support and the Planning and Evaluation Office facilitated all of the meetings. The meetings were held from August through October as follows:

For all of the civic responsibility focus group meetings, the Department provided a brief overview of its mission, the Vision of a Hawaii Public School Graduate, the 2005-2008 Strategic Plan, the Board of Education Policy on Character Education, educational accountability (Act 238, SLH 2000), and Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2004, as amended by Act 221, SLH 2004. The aforementioned documents and philosophies reflect the Department's commitment to help all public school students develop the skills to live and work anywhere in the world.

As noted above, the participants reflected a broad membership of the community-at-large. Approximately 88 of 171 or 51% of the focus group participants were students, community members, or parents.

Each focus group was provided a packet of reference materials that included:

- (1) A memo dated July 29, 2005 from Superintendent Patricia Hamamoto to the Complex Area Superintendents informing them of the establishment of the focus groups;
- (2) S.R. No. 102, Regular Session 2005, *"Requesting the Department of Education to convene a working group to develop a definition of civic responsibility by using an inventory of school-level activities that promote civic learning in students"*;
- (3) A handout on the distinctions between volunteerism, community service, and service learning;
- (4) Civic responsibility concept attainment document produced by a state office work group that delineates what civic responsibility is, what civic responsibility is not, and what it means to be civically responsible;
- (5) SMART (**S**pecific, **M**easurable, **A**ttainable, **R**esults Oriented, **T**imebound) Goals to help the focus groups with setting specific measurable objectives;

- (6) 2005-2008 Department of Education Strategic Plan;
- (7) The Superintendent's 15th Annual Report;
- (8) A 35-page PowerPoint presentation on civic responsibility;
- (9) Civic Responsibility Focus Group Meeting Guiding Questions; and
- (10) Complex-specific *Trend Reports: Educational and Fiscal Accountability*.

The focus groups were tasked with the following responsibilities:

- (1) Operational definition of civic responsibility;
- (2) Measures of civic responsibility; and
- (3) Working student and community examples of civic responsibility.

To achieve the objectives, the following set of guiding questions were used to frame and facilitate the focus group discussions:

- (1) What is the purpose of public school education?
- (2) What is the value of public school education?
- (3) When you think of "civic responsibility" what first enters your mind?
- (4) How would you define "civic responsibility"?
- (5) How do your students/children demonstrate civic responsibility? What are those activities?
- (6) How do you see civic responsibility being measured? What would be the performance and competency indicators for civic responsibility?
- (7) What can schools in partnership with families and the community do to promote civic responsibility? How do we strengthen the partnership between school and community?
- (8) Any comments?

Depending on the total number of focus group members present, participants were divided into two or more sub-groups to answer all of the guiding questions. Upon completion of the guiding questions, each sub-group shared their responses with the entire body. A large group discussion then took place where members had the opportunity to comment and question other members on their responses. Ideally, the Department anticipated that by the end of the meeting, the entire group was able to reach consensus on an operational definition for civic responsibility, how to measure it, and provide feasible examples for students and the community.

II.A. Findings

(1) What is the purpose of public school education?

The Department initiated a discussion among focus group participants on the purpose of public school education to provide a context as well as an introduction to the more specifically-focused consultation on the role and meaning of civic responsibility. Lacking the opportunity to engage in a meaningful and significant dialogue on the purpose of education, focus group participants may not have been able to properly construe the civic mission of schools.

Focus group participants provided a variety of responses to this question, but the collective essence of their contributions was that public schools provide a well-rounded, standards-based education for all children, regardless of background to prepare these students for post secondary education and/or the work force. Participants cautioned that reducing the focus or the emphasis of schools to academics solely does not serve the children or society well. Children have a broad range of needs that must be addressed by the public schools. Those needs fall into the social, emotional, and physical realms as well as well as the academic.

The civic mission of schools was keenly understood by focus group participants. Many individuals asserted that the purpose of a public school education is to help children become productive, contributing, and responsible members of society.

(2) What is the value of public school education?

Focus group members noted the strong interconnection of purpose and value. In other words they argued that mission of the schools is vital to the well-being of the individual as well as the community. In addition, they often painted a fundamental distinction between public and private education. While both public and private education prepare students to take their rightful place in society as workers and citizens, public education is distinguished from private education in its emphasis on the provision of an equal opportunity for all children to succeed.

(3) When you think of “civic responsibility”, what first enters your mind?

Responses ranged from the conceptual to the concrete. Conceptually, civic responsibility is an individual’s understanding and behavior driven by what is best for society or the community rather than what is best for oneself. This concept is expressed by the individual in concrete terms such as participating in community activities and doing something for others. The concept of being either respectful and/or responsible permeated the discussion. Thus, an individual who truly demonstrates civic responsibility is responsible for and concerned about the well-being of other human beings, and respects and upholds the rights, values, and concerns of all members of the community. In addition, civic responsibility incorporates and fully integrates knowledge and action. Well-informed decision-making is key to a commitment to the community where the individual takes

action when necessary. In addition, civic responsibility is the adoption of specific attributes. These include, but are not limited to demonstrating trustworthy behavior and taking care of others.

For many individuals, the first thing that comes to mind is a specific activity such as food drives, Kids Voting, campus beautification, student government, recycling, beach cleanups, Jump Rope for Heart, jury duty, and Math Olympics. Thus, the essential message these individuals conveyed is that civic responsibility is service to others and to the community.

(4) How would you define “civic responsibility”?

Several focus groups initiated the development of their definition with a review of the Department’s current definition of civic responsibility stated as follows:

“Participation in the life of a school community in an informed, committed and constructive manner with a focus on the common good.”

This tactic proved to be successful as it helped to generate a broad array of ideas and promoted some concerns about crafting a narrow focus. For example, there was some concern that the Department’s definition targeted the school community rather than the broader community or society generally. In addition, there was some anxiety about what the term “common good” really means. The following are additional concepts and ideas that were proposed:

(5) How do your students/children demonstrate civic responsibility? What are those activities?

This question was perhaps the easiest to answer, generating a number of broad and general concepts, such as “positive action”, “volunteerism”, “being lawful”, “being a good citizen”, having a vision”, “tolerating differences”, “modeling good character”, and “keeping well informed”. In addition, participants identified many specific activities in which students had or could have participated. These activities included but were not limited to the following alphabetical list:

Several factors determine the type and number of activities in which an individual might participate. These factors might include but are not be limited to: whether or not there are strong clubs or role models in the school; whether the activity appeals to and motivates the students, the amount of time needed to participate, whether the activity is perceived as helping others; whether the school provides students with a variety of options; and the effort of the school to recognize these students at school functions.

(6) How do you see civic responsibility being measured? What would be the performance and competency indicators for civic responsibility?

Developing a set of indicators to measure civic responsibility proved to be somewhat more problematic for some focus group participants. Some participants asserted that it would be difficult, if not impossible to measure civic responsibility in a meaningful or accurate manner solely based on the extent to which students participated in selected school activities such as service projects, or student governance. They felt that there were a broader set of indicators that would denote whether or not individual student demonstrated civic responsibility and that those indicators measured what an individual student does after exiting the public school system. Some individuals responded that civic responsibility is not a measurable concept. Others asserted that it would most appropriate to allow each school to set up its own unique indicators rather than to force a standardized set upon the entire school system.

In addition, there were concerns about what was perceived to be “forced volunteerism” as a method of getting students into the habit of doing things for

others. This was countered by other participants who noted that requiring students to volunteer for various activities resulted in encouraging students to willingly and enthusiastically sign up to participate in other service projects on their own. Over time, volunteering and helping others becomes second nature.

The following indicators were suggested as possible measures: (1) grades on the General Learner Outcomes on the standards-based report cards; (2) individual student/school portfolios that record a student's involvement in activities each year; (3) senior exit plans; (4) student reflection journals; (5) participation in service-learning projects; (6) graduation on-time; (7) assessment aligned to the Hawaii Content and Performance Standards for physical education, social studies, and career and life skills; (8) student participation in co-curricular activities, (9) a reduction in the number or proportion of referrals and suspensions; and (10) using data in the Comprehensive Student Support System database.

Student participation in projects that had no connection to the school was also considered to be a potential. Such projects might include but not be limited to the construction of homes.

Some individuals suggested using customer service satisfaction surveys to help determine and report on the quality of the student's participation in the service project. Such surveys could be distributed to parents, businesses, organizations, and beneficiary of the service project to determine whether or not expectations had been met.

One group recommended that the Department measure the health of the community as an indicator of civic responsibility. This kind of "temperature check" might include noting whether there is graffiti on public buildings, parents repeatedly participating in school activities and growth of those activities, lower absences and truancy, and higher graduation rates.

(7) What can schools in partnership with families and the community do to promote civic responsibility? How do we strengthen the partnership between school and community?

Focus group participants agreed that teaching civic responsibility, character education, and values should begin and continue to include the home. Administrators, teachers, and other school-level personnel stated in no uncertain terms that their responsibility was to reinforce and support civic engagement rather than be solely responsible for exposing and teaching these ideals to students. A common thread in the discussions in all the focus groups was that parents and legal guardians had the primary responsibility of nurturing their children to become trustworthy and caring citizens.

However, focus group participants acknowledged that for a variety of reasons, many students lacked guidance at home. Thus, the activities and programs in

schools should support the necessary knowledge, awareness, and fundamental skills that help develop students' civic responsibility.

Schools should invite parents and the community to be involved in developing civic responsibility. Schools should be an open and friendly environment for parents, community, and businesses partners. This requires improved communication among school staff, students, parents, community members, and organizations. Some groups asserted that the most successful partnerships first begin in the schools and project outward to the community.

Parent bulletins, e-mails, enhancing the schools' websites, bulletin boards, School Community Council meetings, and written notices all serve to increase personal contact with parents and other community members. Providing a variety of options for parental and community involvement helps to promote participation. Parenting classes were also seen to be useful

Castle Complex participants noted the complex's character education program to help instill positive values and moral behaviors in students. Complex schools realized that they could not do this in isolation. Thus, they sought assistance from the community and local businesses in this effort with the belief that by teaching the same lessons and being consistent gives the students a clear and unified message.

(8) Comments

Participants commented on the difficulty of establishing a working definition for civic responsibility and creating accurate and genuine measures. Participants also noted the importance of "attitude" as a special pre-condition for behavior. They questioned whether it is possible to know for certain whether students have internalized and practiced the different dimensions of civic engagement. How are motivations and motives to be measured? How can schools distinguish between those students who unselfishly provide service to the community or school from those who expect a personal reward?

Several individuals believed that if only schools are responsible for teaching civic responsibility, the Department is setting the schools up to fail. Focus group participants expressed concerns that parents were not taking responsibility in this area and wanted the Department to measure parent participation.

Some individuals stated that while there may be a general discussion about character education and civic responsibility, these are not taught in the classrooms or imbedded in the curriculum.

Others felt that true service-learning requires reflection and should be introduced at a young age. Several individuals believed that if civic responsibility concepts are integrated in classroom instruction, students would pay more attention and be more willing to participate.

II.B. Summary

Working Definition of Civic Responsibility

There was general agreement among the focus groups about the philosophy and concept of civic responsibility – “doing your part”, “community-oriented people working together for the benefit of all”, contributing positively to the community”, and “conscious decision to act for the benefit of society”.

As a starting point for further discussion, the Department staff created a working definition for the civic responsibility focus groups to consider:

Participation by all community members in an informed, committed, caring, and constructive manner with a focus on the common good.

However, the above definition needs to be circulated to all of the focus groups for their overall reaction and subsequent input.

Measures/Indicators of Civic Responsibility

Obviously, a definitive set of statewide measures or indicators was very difficult to establish since many focus groups believed that standardized measures did not give a true or accurate picture of the activities in their schools or the behaviors of students. Due to unique circumstances and sometimes limited resources, schools are forced to improvise and be creative with their activities and programs. As such, students are expected to demonstrate civic responsibility, but in their own unique and special way, and not necessarily using the measures created by the Department.

However, it was generally agreed by all of the focus groups that some acceptable measures/indicators include the creation of individual student portfolios or reflection journals to document their activities, involvement, and growth; multiple assessments such as the General Learner Outcomes and the Hawaii Content and Performance Standards for physical education, social studies, and career and life skills; and customer satisfaction surveys.

Student and Community Examples of Civic Responsibility

All focus groups stated numerous examples of student and community involvement in civic responsibility activities and projects. The activities and projects depended on numerous factors, including but not limited to the motivation of school staff, students, parents, and community members, as well as opportunities offered or available from local organizations. The participants were adamantly opposed to the Department mandating specific activities (e.g., Jump Rope for Heart) in order to satisfy the civic responsibility component.

“No society can long sustain itself unless its members have learned the sensitivities, motivations, and skills involved in assisting and caring for other human beings.”

The Department is very grateful to all of the focus group members for volunteering their time to exchange views on civic responsibility, and hopes to continue this valuable discussion in the future. The Department’s commitment to all of our public school students is to not only provide a solid foundation for academic success, but to partner with parents and the community so that students mature into caring and responsible citizens.
