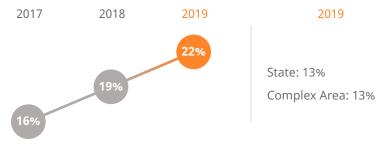


How many 3rd graders read on grade level?

Mauka Lani Elementary School (MLES) is a fully accredited school through the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

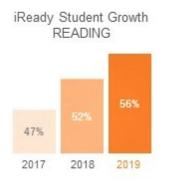

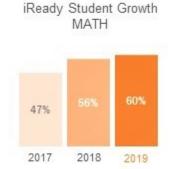

UNIVERSAL SCREENER (iReady) STUDENT GROWTH

Our Local Measure, Universal Screener (iReady) Student Growth, measures the percent of students in kindergarten through the fifth grade who have achieved their grade level's Typical End-of-Year (EOY) Growth Targets (as defined by iReady) for Reading and Math.

Our school continues to work towards increasing the percentage of students who meet the EOY Growth Targets for their grade level so that we may increase the amount of students who are proficient in ELA and Math, as well as close the achievement gaps between our High-Needs and Non-High Needs students.





Over half of our students continued to meet their grade level's EOY Growth Targets for Reading and Math during SY 2018-2019. Students demonstrated a four percent increase in Reading and four percent increase in Math as compared to iReady data from SY 2017-2018. These results represent the second consecutive year that MLES students have demonstrated increases in the attainment of their iReady growth targets.

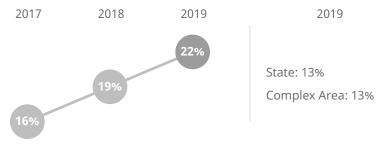


How many 3rd graders read on grade level?

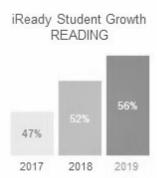

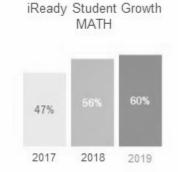
